

# End Uyghur Forced Labour

## Uyghur Labour Rights Intern Summer/ Fall 2026 - Spring 2027 (Remote)

The **Coalition to End Forced Labour in the Uyghur Region** consists of 400+ civil society organisations, trade unions, and investors united to end state-imposed forced labour and other egregious human rights abuses against people from the Uyghur Region in China, known to local people as East Turkistan. We are seeking a **part-time intern** to join our team in the summer or fall of 2026. This is a unique opportunity for a student or young professional to contribute to global advocacy efforts to end Uyghur forced labour using corporate accountability and government advocacy strategies. The position is remote and may include opportunities to attend in-person events.

This internship requires a commitment of approximately 10 hours per week, starting in Summer/Fall 2026 and continuing through Spring 2027. Start and end dates are flexible.

### Responsibilities

The intern will work closely with Coalition staff, Steering Committee members, and working groups to strengthen global advocacy and public awareness to end Uyghur forced labour. Key responsibilities may include:

- Supporting Steering Committee members and working groups with advocacy coordination, outreach, research, event planning, and fundraising.
- Monitoring media coverage, policy developments, corporate responses, and emerging research related to Uyghur forced labour in global supply chains and enforcement of forced labour import bans.
- Assisting in the development of advocacy and communication materials, including press releases, policy submissions, talking points, letters to corporations and policymakers, op-eds, newsletters, infographics, social media content, and short videos.

### Qualifications

We welcome applications from candidates who are committed to advancing Uyghur human rights and workers' rights, who bring the following skills and experience:

- Excellent research, written, and oral communication skills
- Strong planning and organisational skills
- Experience working or volunteering with nonprofits, labour rights organisations,

or community-based advocacy is preferred

- Fluency in English is required. Proficiency in Chinese, Uyghur, or another Turkic language is preferred but not required.
- Experience with social media and content creation is an asset
- Interns based in London, Brussels, or Washington D.C. may have opportunities to attend in-person events; however, applications from any location are welcome. Availability required for at least four hours per week during 9:00 am to 5:00 pm US Eastern time.

## Compensation

- \$18.40/hour for a DC-based intern, or a comparable wage based on location

Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis and will close on **Monday, June 15**. Only shortlisted applicants invited for an interview will receive responses. Interviews are expected to be held during the week of June 22, with an offer anticipated in July.
